The Think Diverse Exhibition – gender, identity, culture

November 2022 saw the first major Think Diverse! event, organised by the Tevere Art Gallery in cooperation with Eurosviluppo Srl and Skill Up Srl.

From 19 to 23 November, the collective art exhibition 'THINK DIVERSE! - gender, identity, culture', curated by Barbara Lalle and Marco Marassi.

On Saturday 19 November 2022 at 6 p.m. the opening was held, attended by around 450 people. On the following days there were a further 150 visitors, making an approximate total of 600 people.

The exhibition is the result of an open call inviting participants to explore all aspects of DSG (Sexual and Gender Diversity), in relationship with the dominant culture or local/global subcultures, through stereotypes, biases, dissimilarities, conformities and conformisms.

There were numerous participants in the competition and a wide diversity of those selected, in the choice of the art media typology, in the variety of performative acts, even in the age of the artists.



The range of authors involved was wide: the youngest artist is an 18-year-old student, Vittoria Di Patre, enrolled in the first year of the Academy of Fine Arts in Rome. The oldest, Bianca Menna, alias Tomaso Binga, is a 91-year-old artist who participated in the 2022 Venice Art Biennale (edition no. 59).

In addition, the exhibition hosted other big names such as Gerald Bruneau (Andy Warhol's Factory) and Angelo Turetta (winner of a 'World Press Photo for art and entertainment' award).






There is also a broad spectrum of interpretations provided by the artists through various forms of art expression: from painting to graphics, photography, illustration, video art, design works, 'art-brut' (spontaneous art) and sculpture.

A separate and prominent place was given to Performance Art and its ability to actively involve those present, where the emotional aspect is directly involved in the performer's actions.

In fact, if theatre is representation and transfiguration, performance is lived life: experience in a determined place, in a limited and unrepeatable time like the very existence of the artist who exposes through his own physicality, his own sufferings and his own most intimate dimension in an active attempt, not mediated by the canvas or frames or sound diffusers, to transfigure himself and transfigure the other in a dimension of the other from himself.
